What You Will Learn

Read this page with your teacher.

When you have read *The Bandman*, *The Mascot*, and *Milton's Problem*, you will be able to read two-syllable words where both the syllables are closed.

You will have learned that:

- There are a group of two-syllable words where both the syllables are closed.
- The first syllable in these words may begin with a vowel, for example, af/ter, a consonant, for example, bas/ket, a consonant digraph, for example, chil/dren, or a consonant blend, for example, trum/pet.
- The second syllable may begin with a consonant, for example, nap/kin, a consonant digraph, for example, en/chant, sand/wich, or a consonant blend, for example, hun/dred, den/tist.

- These words are divided into syllables between the middle consonants so that there is a vowel in each syllable. Be sure to keep the medial blends and/or digraphs together.
- Most of these words will have a short vowel sound as in:

ab/sent tab/let pump/kin chip/munk blan/ket.

However, there are some words that look like they would have a short vowel sound but instead they have a schwa sound, which is usually a short u sound. For example:

the o in cus/tom
the a in com/pass
the e in tun/nel.

"I am not a big hen! I am an ostrich!" said Mildred. "A fantastic ostrich! A fantastic actress! I will not go to tennis and badminton


and dash and gallop about when you are

"I am frantic," said Milton the mantis. "But I will not let you look. I do not like the dentist."


